Individual Student Supplies by Grade
2021-2022 School Year

Parents,

The following is a list of supplies by grade. This is what each teacher would like each student in class to have. Please do not buy spiral bound notebooks for Lower and Middle School. They make a mess when the students tear out the pages. Your student will also need all of the books in the booklist. Please remember to pick up the general supplies listed at the end of this list. **ALL** students should bring a backpack each day to transport supplies and pack lunch in a lunch box or bag. **ALL** students **MUST** also bring a water bottle they can use throughout the day. **DO NOT** send any glass water bottles or glass containers in lunches.

Kindergarten:

- Ticonderoga triangular pencils— primary
- pack of 6 glue sticks
- 24-count box of colored pencils, sharpened
- Pencil sharpener
- 4 large Glue sticks
- 24-count box of crayons
- an eraser separate from those on the pencils
- primary wide ruled journal notebook. The top half of each page had a space for the child to draw a picture. (Mead, available at Walmart or Staples)
- a solid color, two-pocket folder
- pencil case, plastic box type
- refillable, plastic water bottle brought to class already filled each day
- A complete change of clothes in a zip lock plastic bag with their name on it.
- Parents may send their preferred brand/type of hand sanitizer with their students to be used during the day.

First Grade:

- Sharpened Ticonderoga triangular pencils—primary or regular.
- 24-count box of colored pencils, sharpened
- One pack of glue sticks
- a solid color, two-pocket folder
- 12 inch ruler (with centimeters)
- a pencil box
- Child safety scissors
- a reusable water bottle filled and ready to use for each day
- 3 erasers, separate from those on pencils
- Parents may send their preferred brand/type of hand sanitizer with their students to be used during the day.

Second Grade:

- Sharpened Ticonderoga triangular pencils – regular size for the 1st semester.
- In January, sharpened Ticonderoga #2 pencils
- mess-less pencil sharpener (Fiskars brand or similar)
- Red pens or pencils
- 24-count box of colored pencils, sharpened
- 3 erasers separate from those on the pencils - Magic Rub brand is the best
- primary wide ruled journal notebook. The top half of each page had a space for the child to draw a picture. (Mead, available at Walmart or Staples)
- small assignment notebook in which to write homework assignments - *optional*
- Fiskars student scissors
- Glue sticks
- pencil case - fabric, not a hard box, large enough to hold all supplies above
- Two 2 pocket folders (not prong)
- Parents may send their preferred brand/type of hand sanitizer with their students to be used during the day

Third Grade:

- 24 pre-sharpened pencils, Ticonderoga #2
- eraser separate from ones on pencils
- mess-less pencil sharpener (Fiskars brand or similar)
- red ballpoint pen
- plastic 2 pocket folder
- small pencil case
- 12 inch ruler
- 1 1/2 inch binder filled with one pack wide ruled paper - NO spiral notebooks
- 5 tabbed dividers
- small assignment notebook in which to write homework assignments
- wide ruled composition notebook
- non-breakable water bottle filled each day
- Parents may send their preferred brand/type of hand sanitizer with their students to be used during the day.

Fourth Grade:

- 24-count pencils (whichever type the student is comfortable writing with)
- an eraser, separate from the ones on the pencils
- Red pens
- 24-count box of colored pencils, sharpened
- Ruler for after Christmas
- Scissors, small kid kind
- Glue sticks (3)
- 2 composition books may need more later in the year
- 1" or 1.5" binder (1) with dividers (5)

- Loose leaf paper (lots) keep some at home to refill binder throughout year (wide or college ruled)
- Zipper pencil pouch
- Parents may send their preferred brand/type of hand sanitizer with their students to be used during the day.

Optional supplies:

- Small calculator from \$1 store
- Highlighters

Fifth Grade:

- Full, sharpened box of Ticonderoga #2 pencils - at least 2 pencils must be brought to school EACH day
- an eraser, separate from the ones on the pencils
- two blue or black pens
- Two red pens
- Pencil sharpener
- ruler
- A pencil case large enough to hold the above supplies
- 2-inch loose leaf ring binder with one pack of wide rule paper—NO SPIRAL NOTEBOOKS
- extra wide rule notebook paper for their binder (**students keep running out of paper**)
- 5 tabbed dividers
- two graph paper notebooks with 1/4 inch squares (4 x 4 quad ruled) composition type,
- NOT SPIRAL BOUND and NOT 5 x 5 quad ruled. These are hard to find but Walmart has them for under \$1 at back to school time.

- One wide ruled composition notebook
- Parents may send their preferred brand/type of hand sanitizer with their students to be used during the day.

Sixth Grade:

- mechanical pencils OR a full, sharpened box of Ticonderoga #2 pencils
- Small pencil sharpener**
- an eraser, separate from the ones on the pencils
- a pencil case with a zipper and 3 rings so that it can clip in the binder (the kind big enough for a bunch of supplies)
- Large loose leaf ring binder with paper – NO SPIRAL NOTEBOOKS
- extra lined notebook paper for their binder, Wide Rule (**students keep running out of paper**)
- two graph paper notebooks with 1/4 inch squares (4 x 4 quad ruled) composition type,
- A ruler that is 3 hole punched so it can be kept in the binder
- Multi colored Dry Erase Markers and an eraser
- Parents may send their preferred brand/type of hand sanitizer with their students to be used during the day.

Seventh Grade:

- mechanical pencils OR a full, sharpened box of Ticonderoga #2 pencils
- an eraser, separate from the ones on the pencils
- two highlighters
- Multi colored Dry Erase Markers and an eraser
- 2-inch loose leaf ring binder with paper—NO SPIRAL NOTEBOOKS
- extra lined notebook paper for their binder (**students keep running out of paper**)
- at least one folder that has a 3 hole punch to be stored in the binder. One for each subject would be wonderful if affordable, but not necessary.
- 2 packs of graph paper 1/4" ruled or graph paper composition books
- tabbed dividers for each subject for the loose leaf ring binder
- a pencil case with a zipper and 3 rings so that it can clip in the binder (this kind is big enough for a bunch of supplies)
- A ruler, protractor and drawing compass.
- Art and craft supplies as needed for specific projects/assignments
- Parents may send their preferred brand/type of hand sanitizer with their students to be used during the day.

Eighth Grade:

- mechanical pencils OR a full, sharpened box of Ticonderoga #2 pencils
- Pencil sharpener
- Good eraser
- 24-count box of colored pencils, sharpened
- Blue or black gel or ballpoint pens with good ink flow
- A red pen
- Large binder
- 8-tabbed subject dividers for the binder with tabs
- extra loose leaf notebook paper for their binder (reinforced filler paper highly recommended)
- One durable folder, three hole punched for storage in binder
- an eraser, separate from the ones on the pencils
- highlighters
- Vellum tracing paper (this is the thick sturdy tracing paper)
- Three** Composition books (no spiral notebooks)
- 2 graph paper notebooks 1/4" ruled
- A ruler, protractor and drawing compass
- A scientific calculator for math is optional
- Non breakable water bottle
- three hole punched pencil bag to hold these supplies and for easy storage in binder
- Parents may send their preferred brand/type of hand sanitizer with their students to be used during the day.

High School:

In general:

- a binder with pockets or a binder and separate two pocket folder. Students could combine all of their classes into one very large binder but be sure to have a folder for each class.
- Pens, pencils, highlighter, and paper.
- Multi colored Dry Erase Markers and an eraser
- Parents may send their preferred brand/type of hand sanitizer with their students to be used during the day.

All Math Classes:

- Spiral bound notebooks (any type is fine but graph paper is preferred; students with regular notebooks will also need loose leaf graph paper; at least 2 or 3 notebooks will be used during the entire year),
- pencils with erasers,
- loose leaf paper and loose leaf graph paper, and
- a two pocket folder

Geometry:

- a **scientific calculator** (not an app on a phone),
- a drawing compass,
- protractor and
- a ruler

Algebra 2:

- a **scientific calculator** (not an app on a phone)

Pre-Calculus:

- a **graphing calculator**,
- drawing compass,
- protractor and
- ruler

Physical Science:

- Notebook for journaling experiments

Art:

- Students should bring in a 5x7 sketchbook,
- a putty eraser, and
- drawing pencils.

English 10, 11, & 12:

- If you have last year's grammar handbook, please bring it.
- a wide ruled composition book with sewn pages (80-100 pages) to class for grammar & poetry vocabulary work.

English 9:

- ❑ a wide ruled composition book with sewn pages (80-100 pages) to class for grammar work.

American Literature:

- ❑ Loose leaf paper

Composition:

- ❑ a composition style notebook
- ❑ good writing pencils
- ❑ good pens
- ❑ reinforced loose leaf paper highly recommended

American History:

- ❑ A spiral notebook that will be dedicated to American History only, in which to keep cumulative notes throughout the year.
